Listen to the Story of Judith (8.7-12, 15-16, 32-35)

Rev Dr Anne Atwell

Judith was a beautiful widow. Her late husband, Manasseh, had left her great wealth... No one had a bad word to say about her, for she was a godly woman.

So when Judith heard of the people complaining against the king (because their enemies had cut off their water supply in an attempt to overtake them) and of King Uzziah responding to the people by saying he would surrender to the Assyrian armies in 5 days [unless God miraculously came to the aid of Uzziah's people], Judith sent word to Uzziah and the elders of her city.

When they came to her, she said to them: "Listen to me, you rulers. What you said to the people today is not right. You... promised to hand over the city to our enemies unless within a certain time the Lord comes to our aid. Who are you to put God to the test?

If God does not come to our aid within five days, God is equally able to protect us at any time thereafter...Do not impose conditions on the plans of our God. God is not like a human being to be moved by threats, nor like a mortal to be cajoled.

Judith said to them: "Listen to me! I will perform a deed that will go down from generation to generation among our descendants. Stand at the city gate tonight to let me pass through with my maid; and within 5 days the Lord will deliver Israel by my hand. You must not inquire into the affair, for I will not tell you what I am doing until it has been accomplished."

Uzziah and the rulers said to her, "Go in peace, and may God go with you!"

The Story of Judith Continues (9.1-2a, 7-8a, 11-14) Rev Dr Anne Atwell

At the very time when the evening incense was being offered in the house of God in Jerusalem, Judith prayed with a loud voice,

Judith: The Finale (10.10-13, 23; 13.2, 4-11; 16.24) Rev Dr Anne Atwell

Judith went out, accompanied by her maid. The men of the town watched her until she had gone down the mountain and passed through the valley, where they lost sight of her.

Judith and her maid were going straight on through the valley, an Assyrian patrol met her and took her into custody. They asked her, "To what people do you belong, and where are you coming from, and where are you going?" She replied, "I am a daughter of the Hebrews, but I am fleeing from them, for they are about to be handed over to you to be devoured. I am on my way to see Holofernes the commander of your army, to give him a true report; I will show him a way by which he can go and capture all the hill country..."

When Judith came into the presence of Holofernes and his servants, they all marveled at the beauty of her face. She prostrated herself and did obeisance to him, but his attendants raised her up.

[Judith convinced Holofernes that she was on the side of the Assyrians and he welcomed her as his personal guest].

[After a banquet], the servants went to bed leaving Judith alone in the tent, with Holofernes stretched out on his bed, for he was dead drunk.

Then Judith, standing beside his bed, said in her heart, "O God of all might, look in this hour on the work of my hands for the exaltation of Jerusalem. Now indeed is the time to help your heritage and to carry out my design to destroy the enemies who have risen up against us."

She went up to the bedpost near Holofernes' head, and took down his sword that hung there. She came close to his bed, took hold of the hair of his head, and said, "Give me strength today, O God!" Then she struck his neck twice with all her might, and cut off his head. Next she rolled his body off the bed and pulled down the canopy from the posts. Soon afterward she went out and gave Holofernes' head to her maid, who placed it in a bag.

Then the two of them went out together, passed through the camp...and came to the gates. From a distance Judith called out to the sentries at the gates, "Open the gate! Our God is with us, still showing strength against our enemies!"

After this, Judith was held in great esteem...and she was the most renowned woman in all the land...

CELEBRATE PRIDE MONTH WITH SUNSHINE CATHEDRAL – LGBTQ+ pride is the promotion of affirmation, dignity, equality, and increased visibility of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, Queer as well as those who are Questioning, pansexual, non-binary, strong allies to the community, etc. (LGBTQ+) as a social group. Pride, as opposed to shame and social stigma, is the view that bolsters most LGBTQ+ rights movements.

Common symbols of pride are variations of the rainbow or pride flag, the lowercase Greek letter lambda (λ), the pink triangle and the black triangle, these latter two reclaimed from use as badges of shame in WW2 Nazi concentration camps.

THE SACRED HEART AS A SYMBOL OF QUEER COMFORT (by Rev. Dr. Durrell Watkins) - June gives us Father's Day and LGBTQ+ Pride, but June (in the Roman Catholic tradition) is also the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Jesus' Sacred Heart represents love, mercy, grace, and compassion. Jesus' Heart is a symbol of divine love in human experience. Devotion to the Sacred Heart reminds us that faith should be kind and caring.

In the 18th century, Pope Clement approved the Feast of the Sacred Heart for certain locations. In the mid-19th century, Pope Pius approved the Feast for the whole Church. In 1899, Pope Leo dedicated the entire Catholic world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. During his pontificate, John Paul 2 maintained a devotion to the Heart of Jesus.

According to tradition, devotees of the Sacred Heart can expect various blessings and aid throughout life, including inner peace and strong faith.

I love that this Sacred Heart celebration shares a month with LGBTQ+ Pride. The Heart of Jesus is a heart filled with justice-love, a heart with room for all who suffer, a heart that wishes joy and healing for everyone. The Heart of Jesus as a symbol of love seems fitting during a month where people are celebrating their love over against objections and insults from the worlds of politics and religion. People who have been heartbroken by rejection and cruelty can imagine a loving Heart that will always embrace them and never turn them away.

The sacred symbol won't be a comfort for everyone, but for those who miss (or never had but would like to try on) some of the metaphors and symbols of traditional faith, the Sacred Heart may be a balm for the pain that others have inflicted in the name of religion. We are certainly entitled to reject religion, but we also can reclaim and redefine religion. Those who weaponized it do not hold the deed to faith.

Let's imagine the Sacred Heart as a sign of love for all who need Love's healing touch, especially the Queer children of God.



SAINTS OF THE WEEK

June 15: Evelyn Underhill (1875 – 1941) – Anglo-Catholic writer and pacifist who focused on spiritual practice and Christian mysticism. Of beauty she wrote, "Beauty is simply reality seen with the eyes of love." And of the practicality of communion with the Divine she wrote, "After all it is those who have a deep and real inner life who are best able to deal with the irritating details of outer life."

June 17: Joel Goldsmith (1892 – 1964) – Goldsmith was reared in a secular Jewish family, but both he and his father (at different times) experienced healing with the aid of Christian Science practitioners. Goldsmith discovered that he seemed to have a gift for spiritual healing. He became a Christian Scientist and later started the Infinite Way movement. He stressed the practice of contemplative meditation. Goldsmith believed healing occurred from conscious contact with God. There is no service, ritual, dogma, or ceremony in the practice of the Infinite Way. Goldsmith students can practice any (or no) religion. He wrote, "God is felt as a divine Presence or Influence within."

Masaharu Taniguchi (1893 - 1985) - founded Seicho-No-le in Japan where it has over 5 million members. SNI has become a world-wide New Thought movement. SNI doesn't ask people to give up any religious affiliation to be part of their system; in that way, they are inter-religious and transdenominational. Taniguchi came to realize: "All evil things are nothingness. They could never be the product of Divine Will but of [the human] deluded mind", "Everything that occurs in [one's] environment is a reflection of his [or her] mind. The same is true with [one's] physical body". "The Phenomena are non-existent. That which is truly real and eternal is only God and [God's] manifestations. [The human-being] is truly a child of God [and] is already immaculate and redeemed." People claimed to be healed of diseases simply by listening to Taniguchi lecture. SNI calls the impermanent and ever-changing world of appearances the "phenomenal world." Shinsokan is the meditation technique taught to help people experience the Universal Reality commonly called "God." "True Image" is what SNI calls one's true Self, one's Real identify, the harmonious and divine essence of All That Is.
