A reading from the Fourth Gospel (John 11.1-3, 6-8, 14, 16-25, 27-30, 32-44) Rev Dr Anne Atwell

Now a man was ill, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. Mary was the one who had anointed the Lord with perfumed oil and dried his feet with her hair; it was her brother Lazarus who was ill. So the sisters sent word to him, saying, "Master, the one you love is ill."

So when Jesus heard that Lazarus was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea." The disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the religious authorities were just trying to stone you, and you want to go back there?" Jesus said, "Our friend Lazarus is asleep, but I am going to awaken him." Jesus then said to them clearly, "Lazarus has died. So Thomas, called Didymus,[d]said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go to die with him."

When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, only about two miles away. And many religious leaders had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them about their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home.

Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. [But] even now I know that whatever you ask of God. God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life...She said to him, "Lord. I have come to believe that you are God's anointed, the chosen one...'

When she had said this, she went and called her sister Mary secretly, saying, "The teacher is here and is asking for you." As soon as she heard this, she rose guickly and went to him. For Jesus had not yet come into the village, but was still where Martha had met him. When Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping... he became ... troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the onlookers said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said, "Could not the one who restored sight to the blind have done something so that this man would not have died?"

So Jesus, perturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Jesus said to her. "Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Abba, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me..." And when he had said this, he cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go."

WEDNESDAYS IN LENT - (Mar 9 - Apr 13) online Lenten series presented by Rev. Barbara Essex (Wednesday at 6 pm on our Facebook page).

LENTEN FOOD DRIVE - Sunday, March 6, is Loaves and Fishes Sunday when we ask the Sunshine Cathedral community to bring non-perishable food donations for the Food Sharing Ministry. It is also the first Sunday of the Lenten Food Drive (we will receive donations each week in Lent to help replenish our food pantry). Please see any Loaves and Fishes team member for a list of suggested items.

LENT – is a period of spiritual reflection and devotion leading to Easter. Lent lasts from Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday. Lenten practitioners often "fast" (giving up something and filling the absence with prayer and study...one can fast from certain kinds of foods or from alcohol, or, one may choose to fast from pessimism, self-pity, habitual complaining, or, rather than giving up something one can take on something positive, like an exercise routine, an intention to drink more water, or a commitment to be a more enthusiastic recycler). In addition to fasting, other Lenten disciples include generosity, being faithful to regular worship, and developing routines of study and prayer. Lent can be a time of spiritual renewal. Worship with us throughout Lent and invite others to join you. May our Lenten journeys lead us all to Easter joy! Amen.

In 2017 he was the first transgender man to be featured in a Diesel campaign, and in February 2020, became one of the faces of the Abercrombie FIERCE campaign. Laith was on the cast of reality TV series "Strut" and raised the heart rates of viewers in his appearance on season one: episode 6 of hit series, "Pose", on FX. He now uses his platform to help inform others about the trans experience, and the experience of other marginalized groups, as well as advocating for social justice, in hopes for a more open, loving and accepting world.

OPTIMISTIC WOMEN – March is **Women's History Month** and **National Optimism Month**. This week's "Saints of the Week" include a couple women pioneers of the New Thought movement (Nona Brooks and Annie Ritz Militz). New Thought is a spiritual philosophy centered on optimism grounded in the experience of God as a loving omnipresence. Our saints list also include woman of optimism and profound courage, Harriet Tubman. And while we may not know much about the optimism of Ss. Perpetua and Felicity, we do about their faith and courage. Sainted Women of Hope and Heroism, pray for us. Amen.

TODAY'S CONTEMPORARY READING – is by Dr. Julia Seton Sears (1862-1950), the founder of New Civilization centers. She embraced an esotericmetaphysical point of view and was one of the people who influenced New Thought leaders Ernest and Fenwicke Holmes. Seton Sears was a medical doctor, spiritual writer, poet, and she twice lectured her way around the world.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

March 6: Nona Brooks (1861 – 1945) – a major figure in the New Thought movement and one of the pioneers of Divine Science. Nona taught, "We no longer feel that we must overcome God's reluctance, but rather that we are to lay hold of [God's] willingness. More willing is [God] to give than we are to receive." She also stressed divine Omnipresence: "...let us turn to our Basis, Omnipresence. This means God everywhere; therefore, God includes me."

March 7: Ss. Perpetua and Felicity (d. 203)— Martyrs. Perpetua, who came from a wealthy family in North Africa, and Felicity, her friend and servant, were martyred at Carthage during a period of Roman persecutions. Despite the pleadings of her family and the prospect of being torn apart by savage animals, Perpetua refused to renounce her Christian faith. In death they comforted each other, and in one final act before the jeering crowds they kissed each other. Writings about their death were wildly popular in the early church, and are important for reflecting the perspective of an independent woman of faith who claimed her own identity and vocation despite the demands of a patriarchal society.

Paramahansa Yogananda (1883 – 1952) – a spiritual teacher who emphasized each individual's ability to experience Truth for herself or himself rather than relying on inherited or "blind" belief. He believed every individual has the ability to experience the Divine directly and should rely on that experience more than on religious dogma. Yogananda wrote, "As long as you are making the effort, God will never let you down!"

March 8: Annie Rix Militz (1856 – 1924) - was the founder of both the New Thought publication Master Mind magazine and the Homes of Truth. Militz wrote, "We trust God not only as our physician, but as our banker, our defender, as our [spouse], our [parent], our all in all..."

March 9: Mikao Usui (1865 – 1926) - the founder of the complementary healing technique known as "Reiki" (universal life-force energy). Reiki practitioners allow themselves to be a channel of Universal Life-force Energy, imagining symbols as they place hands on or near certain spots of a person's body (they also give

"distant treatments" for people far away). Practitioners share the energy but remain detached from the outcome. They trust the energy will flow freely to accomplish whatever is most needed. The principles Reiki practitioners try to live by are simply: "Do not be angry. Do not worry. Be grateful. Work with diligence. Be kind to people." Reiki is not a religion and can be practiced by people of any or no faith tradition.

A.K. Mozumdar (1864 – 1953) - Born in India, Mozumdar came to the U.S. to teach his understanding of spiritual principles. Mozumdar's beliefs about the connection between the mind and the body are now widely shared by both religious and secular thinkers. Mozumdar taught that God is within us, inseparable from us. Mozumdar's quotes include: "That which you imagine with a positive assurance becomes a reality to you" and "Convince yourself that you have the ability to do a certain thing, and you will have the ability." Ernest Holmes was a friend and admirer of Mozumdar.

March 10: Harriet Tubman (1820?-1913)—Abolitionist. Born into slavery, Tubman escaped to the North in 1849. In the next 10 years she made 19 trips into the South, leading 300 slaves to freedom. Soon she was known as 'Moses.' During the Civil War she served as a spy, scout, and nurse. Later she worked for the cause of women's suffrage. She was a member of the AME Zion Church.

March 11: Saint Avertanus and Blessed Romeo -14th century French monks, traveling companions and "AIDS patrons" who died together of the plague and share the same coffin.
