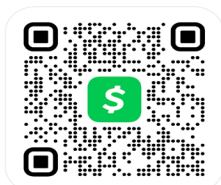

LOAVES & FISHES - We ask the Sunshine Cathedral community to bring non-perishable food donations for the Food Sharing Ministry on the first Sunday of each month. This helps us feed over 600 people each week in need of a helping hand.

WELLNESS - At Sunshine Cathedral Square, you can receive Covid testing 7 days per week, STI testing twice per month (1st & 3rd Tuesdays 5 pm - 8 pm courtesy of Broward House), food assistance on Wednesdays (until about 1 pm), and grief support twice a month (contact Rev. Dr. Anne Atwell about the grief support group). Condoms are available in our restrooms, vaccinations are encouraged and hand sanitizer can be found at the doorways of the Worship Center.

GLOBAL FELLOWSHIP - If you don't live in the Fort Lauderdale area but are finding Sunshine Cathedral to be a primary source of spiritual enrichment in your life, we invite you to consider joining the Sunshine Cathedral Global Fellowship. OUR SUNDAY BROADCAST is made possible by Happening Out Television Network and donors who support our televised ministry. Happening Out is housed at Sunshine Cathedral Square. Happening Out programming can be viewed on YouTube, Facebook, Amazon Fire, Apple TV, Google TV, and Roku.

SAGE – Friendly Visitor Program for LGBTQ seniors at Sunshine Cathedral - the program has been under development and now has a coordinator: Mitchell Zahn. Mitchell has over 35 years of experience with community-based organizations and government agencies, including work with older adults and people living with HIV. He also has had volunteer management experience, and has done a bunch of volunteering himself. More information about this exciting new program will be coming soon.

CONTEMPORARY READING – (April 24) Thomas Cathcart who holds a philosophy degree from Harvard and attended seminary in Chicago. He writes about religious and philosophical issues in ways that are accessible and easy to digest. He is the author of 6 books, including the best-selling *Plato and a Platypus Walk into a Bar*, and most recently, *There is No God and Mary is His Mother: Rediscovering Religionless Christianity*; (May 1) Vikas Khanna, a celebrity chef in India and internationally known humanitarian.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

April 25: St. Mark the Evangelist—Evangelist. The writer of the oldest gospel in our canon. Mark's gospel was written around 70 ce.

April 27: Ralph Waldo Emerson (1803 – 1882) - American essayist, philosopher, poet, and leader of the Transcendentalist movement in the early 19th century. His teachings directly influenced the growing New Thought movement of the mid-1800s. Emerson wisely noted, "A person will worship something, have no doubt about that. We may think our tribute is paid in secret in the dark recesses of our hearts, but it will come out. That which dominates our imaginations and our thoughts will determine our lives, and our character. Therefore, it behooves us to be careful what we worship, for what we are worshipping, we are becoming." Referring to divine unity and omnipresence, Emerson wrote, "the currents of the Universal Being circulate through me; I am part and parcel of God."

April 28: Oskar Schindler (1908-1974) —"Righteous Gentile." Schindler was a German industrialist who made a fortune on the labor of Jews in his factory. Although raised as a Catholic, he was not religious. For reasons which have never been clear, and at great personal risk, he used his power and influence to save the lives of 1,100 men, women, and children during WW2. At the end of the war he was impoverished. Today he is buried in Jerusalem at Yad Vashem (Holocaust Memorial) among the "Righteous Gentiles."

April 29: St. Catherine of Siena (1347-1380)—Doctor of the Church. An Italian mystic, teacher, and nun, Catherine devoted herself to serving the poor and sick around her. She experienced ecstatic visions and was believed to have received the sign of the stigmata.

April 30: Pseudo-Dionysius (5th or 6th century) – mystical theologian who influenced later mystics, theologians, and philosophers. He understood "god-talk" to always be symbolic, that is, divine Transcendence necessitates speaking of the Divine in symbols, but whatever we say about God must fall short of all that God is. He believed "evil" is temporary and has no real substance to it.

May 1: St. Thomas a Kempis (1380-1471)—Priest. Thomas was a simple Augustinian monk whose life is not remembered so much as his writings. His best known work on the spiritual life is *The Imitation of Christ*, a classic that has been influential among both Protestants and Catholics. He emphasized that our actions are far more important than our knowledge: "At the Day of Judgment we shall not be asked what we have read, but what we have done."

May 2: Hannah More Kohaus (1844 – 1914) – poet and hymn writer, best known for her “Prayer of Faith” which is recited or sung in many New Thought churches.

May 3: Apostle Philip – chosen by Jesus, the Apostle Philip should not be confused with Philip the Deacon.

May 4: David S. Alkins (1922 – 2015) – was an Episcopal priest (graduate of both New England Conservatory of Music and Berkeley Divinity School at Yale University) who served parishes in Texas and Washington state as well as working with various non-profit agencies. In 1979 he became the Dean of Brooks Divinity School (named for Nona Brooks, it was a Divine Science ministry school in Denver) and received an honorary doctorate in 1987. His two small publications were “Bridge Builders of Truth” and Jesus the Way Shower.

May 6: Henry David Thoreau (1817-1862)—Naturalist and social critic. While his writings were largely ignored in his lifetime, Thoreau’s thoughts on social justice, freedom, and civil disobedience were to later influence Tolstoy, Gandhi, and Martin Luther King. A fiercely independent nonconformist, he followed no particular religion, but has been described as something of a Taoist sage. His mystical rapture with nature speaks to us today in our ecological concerns. Some historians speculate that Thoreau may have been gay.
