The Wisdom of Nona Brooks

Rev Dr Durrell Watkins

"Three weeks of study and treatment with [Emma Curtis Hopkins in Chicago] brought Mrs. Frank Bingham back to Pueblo radiant and with health and joy [whereas before, she had been quite ill]...Friends and neighbors began asking Mrs. Bingham to tell them what had brought about her transformation. Informal classes grew up in response to these requests; she gave in simple language what she had learned from Mrs. Hopkins. [My sisters and I] were always invited to these meetings, and knowing how much we needed what she was giving...we accepted. We were, as a family, in sad condition physically and financially...

I, myself, was in very poor physical condition, being able to eat only very soft, [specially] prepared food. For more than a year I had been praying almost constantly, 'Give me light.' On the Sunday before we were to start our new lessons with Mrs. Bingham, I attended my church, where during the communion service the song to be sung was, 'nearer My God to Thee.' I could not bring myself to sing the first stanza, 'nearer my God to Thee, nearer to Thee, e'en tho' it be a cross that raiseth me.'

I rebelled – I and my family had had all the crosses we could possibly bear. As the congregation sang I was filled with an inner turmoil, but as the song progressed I realized a complete surrender of myself and of the family conditions in order that I might be nearer to God and so I was able to sing the last stanza with the others.

It was during the fourth class lesson...with Mrs. Bingham that my whole being was completely filled with a great light

— a light brighter than sunlight, brighter than any I had ever seen. It filled me! It surrounded me! I was conscious of nothing but that intense white light! I thought that of course all in the room had seen the light too, but they had not. I alone had this wonderful experience. I discovered that I had been instantly and completely healed.

Tho' the actual healing was instantaneous, yet I truly believe that the months and months of praying that I might receive light had been a preparation for the healing which had actually come to me in the form of light."

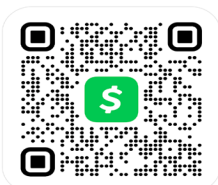

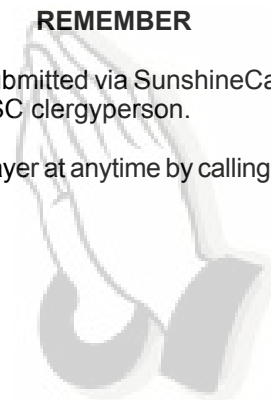

HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY – Mother's Day is a celebration honoring the mother of a family or individual, as well as motherhood, maternal bonds, and the influence of mothers in society. It is celebrated on different days in many parts of the world. We recognize birth mothers, adoptive mothers, foster mothers, aunts and grandmothers who nurtured and cared for us, and even spiritual mothers who took us into their hearts at any point in our lives. Anyone who has parented or co-parented, regardless of gender, has probably embraced some of the roles traditionally associated with motherhood. And for those who never experienced good "mothering" or who have not yet had the chance to experience a form of motherhood, we give thanks that divine Love can be known to us as a universal and eternal Mother. Happy Mother's Day to all.

SAGE – Friendly Visitor Program for LGBTQ seniors at Sunshine Cathedral - the program has been under development and now has a coordinator: Mitchell Zahn. Welcome to Sunshine Cathedral SAGE and Mitchell Zahn.

CONTEMPORARY READING – Nona Brooks was a pioneer of the early Divine Science movement and the key leader of the movement after its original founder, Malinda Cramer, died. Nona Brooks experienced a profound spiritual healing in her life, came to understand God as a benevolent omnipresence, and ordained Emmet Fox who long after his demise remains a popular self-help and spirituality teacher through his many writings.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

May 8: Blessed Julian of Norwich (1342-1416)—Mystic. Few details are known of the life of Dame Julian, a recluse who was famed as a spiritual counselor. She is best known for writing *Revelations of Love Divine*, the first book written in English by a woman. At the age of 30 she became gravely ill, but recovered following a series of visions of Christ. She spoke of God as our Creator, Protector, and Lover, and wrote of the motherhood of both God and of Jesus, emphasizing the goodness of creation and God's mercy toward the weak. "As truly as God is our Father, so truly is God our Mother." She is often called "Blessed" even though she was never formally beatified.

May 10: Ida B. Elliott (1862 – 1957) – Divine Science founder Malinda Elliott Cramer's niece. Ordained by Nona Brooks (the originator of the Divine Science teachings in Colorado and the de facto leader of the movement after Malinda's death) in 1907. Ida wrote books of her own, had a ministry in Oakland, CA, and contributed to *Mind Remakes Your World* (edited by Ernest Holmes).

May 12: J. Krishnamurti (1895 – 1986) - born in India and adopted by Theosophist Dr. Annie Besant. Dr.

Besant declared that Krishnamurti would become a global teacher whose coming had been predicted by Theosophists. The Order of the Star in the East was formed and the young Krishnamurti was to be its head. But in 1929, Krishnamurti renounced the role that was prophesied for him and dissolved the Order. For the next six decades he traveled around the world speaking to large audiences (as a global teacher after all!) about the need for a change in humankind. Rather than promoting any particular religion, he simply spoke of our universal longing for happiness and the need to release internal anger and fear which keep that happiness from us.
