### A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (17.16-31) Rev Dr Anne Atwell

While Paul was...in Athens, he was outraged to note that the city was full of idols. Therefore, he debated in the synagogue with the Jews and the Gentile God-Worshipers, and also in the city square with whoever chanced to be there. Even a few Epicurean and Stoic philosophers argued with him. Some asked, "What is this man babbling about?" Others said, "Apparently, he is here to promote foreign deities," because he was preaching about Jesus and the resurrection.

Therefore, they took him and brought him to the Areopagus and asked him, "Can you explain to us what this new doctrine is that you are teaching? You are presenting strange ideas to us, and we would like to find out what they all mean." The major pastime of the Athenians and the foreigners living there was to spend their time telling or listening to the latest ideas.

Then Paul stood before them in the Areopagus and said: "People of Athens, I have seen how religious you are. For as I walked around, looking carefully at your shrines, I noticed among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an Unknown God.' What, therefore, you worship as unknown, I now proclaim to you.

"The God who made the world and everything in it, the sovereign of heaven and earth, does not dwell in shrines made by human hands. Nor is God served by human hands as though God could need anything. Rather, it is God who gives to everyone life and breath and all other things...God did this so that people might seek God in the hope that by groping for Truth they might find It, even though indeed the true God is not far from any one of us. For 'In God we live and move and have our being.' As even your own poets have said, 'We are all God's offspring.'

Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like an image of gold or silver or stone, fashioned by human art and imagination. God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, but now commands people everywhere to [wake up]...[and the wakeup call] was raising a chosen one from the dead."

In these human words, God's voice is heard.

### The Lord's Supper Rev Dr Durrell Watkins

Respectful burial of the dead was very important in antiquity for pagans, Jews, and Christians. Above ground cemeteries existed on privately owned land, but early Christians were often not wealthy enough to be land owners. Underground burial, in the catacombs, was efficient and more affordable. Early Christians also made a connection with burial and Jesus. Since Jesus was buried, they found it comforting to bury their departed loved one as Jesus had been buried, and to hope for resurrection as they believed he had been resurrected.

The catacombs also provided a bit of privacy so that people could share memorial feasts with their departed loved ones, undisturbed (memorial meals were common at the time for people of various religions).

As the new religion, Christianity, started facing persecution, some legends say the Christians would hide in the catacombs, but since the locations and functions of the catacombs were well known, they might not have made good hiding places after all. What is known is that when it became dangerous to display Christian symbols publicly, believers would carve and paint them in the catacombs. The Good Shepherd, the Greek letters Chi and Rho, the Fish, and paintings of baptisms and the Resurrection could be found among the graves of the Christian dead. People would gather in the catacombs for various rituals, such as Holy Communion.

Above the remains of our Christian ancestors, in one of the oldest churches in continuous use in the world, Sunshine Cathedral in April 2022 celebrated the Eucharist in the catacombs. In the place where Christians would have partaken of the Lord's Supper as far back as the 2nd or 3rd century, surrounded by their graves and bits of their sacred art, a group from Sunshine Cathedral shared grape and grain in memory of Jesus.


### SAINTS OF THE WEEK

*May 15: Claudine Whitaker (1892 – 1970) –* Episcopal deaconess who became first a Divine Science and then Religious Science minister. She founded a church in Chicago which she led from 1943 to 1969. For much of that time she taught summer courses in Divine Science.

*May 16: Thomas Troward (1847-1916)* – Judge (in India) and New Thought pioneer, Troward influenced such thinkers as Emmet Fox and Religious Science founder Ernest Holmes. Troward believed that "Belief in limitation is the one and only thing that causes limitation."

May 17: Blessed Josephine Bakhita (1869-1947)—Exslave and nun. Born in the African nation of Sudan, at the age of nine Bakhita was kidnapped and sold into slavery. Eventually she was bought by a family who took her back to Italy. Upon hearing the gospel she understood that God meant for her to be free. She went to court to gain her freedom, and then discovered that slavery was illegal in Italy! She was then baptized and took religious vows as a nun. She spent her life serving others, and became famous for her quiet faith.

*May 20: Tehilla Lichtenstein* (1893 – 1973) – cofounder with her husband, Morris, of the Society for Jewish Science (a metaphysical interpretation and application of Judaism). She was born in Jerusalem and immigrated to the U.S. when she was eleven. After her husband, a rabbi, died, Tehilla took over the leadership of the Society for Jewish Science, making her the first Jewish woman in the U.S. with her own pulpit, even though she was never ordained a rabbi.
