ADVENT - Advent is a season of the liturgical year observed in most Christian denominations as a time of expectant waiting and preparation for both the celebration of the Nativity of Christ at Christmas and the return of Christ (sometimes called "second coming"). At Sunshine Cathedral, we suggest that "we" are the return of Christ, those of us who, in his name, share the good news of God as love and who seek to demonstrate love by working for justice, showing compassion, and by living humbly before the mysteries of life.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

November 27: Charles Haanel (1866 – 1949) – author of The Master Key System, a book that laid out principles that Napoleon Hill credited with helping him succeed in his work. Haanel taught: "There is a world within — a world of thought and feeling and power; of light and life and beauty; and, although invisible, its forces are mighty." Haanel is quoted in the popular self-help book, The Secret.

Harvey Milk (1931-1978) — First openly gay elected official (USA). Milk ran for a seat as a City Supervisor in San Francisco in order to stand for the rights of people without a voice — blue collar workers, the elderly, racial minorities, and especially gays and lesbians. He expected he would die violently, and was shot five times at close range by another politician angered at his stand for gays. That night 40,000 people took to the streets in a candle light vigil outside City Hall. He is remembered because, as Cardinal Juan Fresnos of Chile said, "Whosoever stands up for human rights stands up for the rights of God."

November 28: James Allen (1864 – 1912) – best known for his book As a Man Thinketh, which has been mass produced since its original publication in 1903. His work is still lauded by motivational speakers and inspirational writers. Allen counseled: "[One's] mind may be likened to a garden, which may be intelligently cultivated or allowed to run wild."

November 29: Dorothy Day (1897-1980) — Prophet of social justice. Despite the fact she held no official position in the Catholic church, and that her thoughts were mostly rejected in her life, it was said at her death that she was "the most influential, interesting, and significant figure" in the history of American Catholicism. Committed to social justice and pacifism, she founded a lay movement, the Catholic Worker movement, which sought to live out the radical gospel commandment of love in the social and political realm by embracing voluntary poverty.

November 30: Apostle Andrew (First Century) – Patron of Scotland.

Oscar Wilde: Oscar Fingal O'Flaherty Wills Wilde (16 October 1854 – 30 November 1900) was an Irish poet, playwright, and great wit. He is best remembered for the novel, The Picture of Dorian Gray, the play, The Importance of Being Earnest, and the circumstances of his criminal conviction for "gross indecency" for a consensual homosexual relationship with Lord Alfred "Boise" Douglas, imprisonment, and early death from meningitis at age 46. He converted from Anglicanism to Roman Catholicism on his death bed (he had been fascinated by Catholicism for a while). Wilde's lover, Lord Alfred, was the one who coined "the love that dare not speak its name" as a euphemism for homosexuality.

December 1: World AIDS Day—Since 1988 this day has been a time for remembering those who have died and for renewing our commitment to support those living with HIV throughout the world. The red ribbon, which began as a "grass roots" effort, has become an international symbol of AIDS awareness.

December 3: Mary Baker Eddy (1821 – 1910): Author of Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures and Founder of the First Church of Christ, Scientist in Boston. Also the leading figure in the Christian Science movement. Mrs. Eddy said, "To those leaning on the sustaining infinite, today is big with blessings."

Freda Smith (1935 – 2019) – first woman to be licensed and ordained as clergy in Metropolitan Community Churches, first woman to serve on the Council of Elders in MCC, and the person who led the effort to make denominational bylaws gender inclusive. Her most famous sermon was "Purple Grass" about a lamb that was shunned for preferring purple grass to the more common green grass, but the Shepherd affirmed the lamb and assured it that it was loved just as it was. She was also known for a provocative performance piece, "Dear Dora/ Derek, Dangerous Diesel Dyke."

December 4: St. Barbara (d. 306) – Barbara, a pagan, embraced the Christian faith and dedicated herself to serving the Lord as a consecrated virgin. Her father tried to arrange marriages for her but she always refused. Her father had a bathhouse built for her. It became a place of healing. St. Simeon Metaphrastes compared it to the stream of Jordan.

In time, Barbara ran away from her father but he found her (with the help of a shepherd who, as a result of his helping to capture Barbara, found his flocks, according to legend, turned to locusts) and locked her away. Still she would not marry nor renounce her newfound faith. Prayer gave her the strength to endure her trials.

Finally, Barbara was condemned to death by beheading by her father. Her martyrdom took place on December 4th. Soon after, her father was struck by lightning.

A SORDID ADVENT - Join us tonight at 6 pm for a FREE showing of Sordid Lives.

In just the last couple of months the world has lost both Olivia Newton-John and Leslie Jordan, both of whom were in the cast of the film *Sordid Lives*.

To show this film at the beginning of Advent is meaningful because the first Sunday in Advent is dedicated to Hope and both Newton-John and Jordan offered hope throughout their careers. Dame Olivia Newton-John lived with cancer on and off for decades and survived two bouts of cancer before the third bout ended her life at 73.

In addition to being a living model of facing difficulties with hope and courage, she also worked to bring hope to Queer people as she was one of the first celebrities to advocate for marriage equality in Australia.

Leslie Jordan, who died at age 67, was a very "out" gay man who brought joy through comedy to people all over the world. He also brought comic relief to us in pandemic by taking to social media just to give us a few chuckles in lockdown.

Jordan frequently spoke about living in recovery. He would speak at Alcoholic Anonymous events to encourage large numbers of people seeking to remain in sobriety. Both Jordan and Newton-John played Queer characters in the film. Sordid Lives.

A gay man and a fierce straight ally, both of whom lived out loud to give people facing discrimination, illness, and addiction hope, were lost to us in 2022, but their work and their generosity live on. We happily begin our Season of Advent, on Hope Sunday, with a showing of Sordid Lives.
