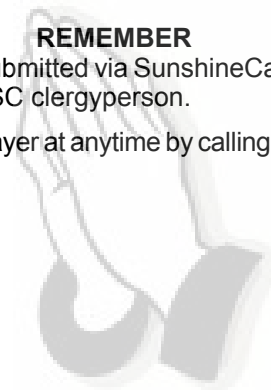

ADVENT - Advent is a season of the liturgical year observed in most Christian denominations as a time of expectant waiting and preparation for both the celebration of the Nativity of Christ at Christmas and the return of Christ (sometimes called “second coming”). At Sunshine Cathedral, we suggest that “we” are the return of Christ, those of us who, in his name, share the good news of God as love and who seek to demonstrate love by working for justice, showing compassion, and by living humbly before the mysteries of life.

OUR SUNDAY BROADCAST is made possible by Happening Out Television Network and donors who support our televised ministry. Happening Out is housed at Sunshine Cathedral Square. Happening Out programming can be viewed on YouTube, Facebook, Amazon Fire, Apple TV, Google TV, and Roku.

CATHEDRAL SECURITY – There is news almost every week of harassment and intimidation of LGBTQ+ and African American and Jewish groups. We hope that Sunshine Cathedral will never be targeted, but we want you to know that we are doing everything possible to stay safe.

We have security cameras throughout the property, a good relationship with law enforcement, and extra security is hired or provided by police at select events. Our staff has had active shooter training, and during services we keep all doors other than the front entry doors locked. Cell phones can record incidents and allow us to call for help. We have people throughout the worship center every Sunday who intentionally keep a look out for suspicious activity. We

are doing everything possible to keep our worshiping community safe.

If you ever feel unsafe, you can watch services online from home – whenever you use that option please remember that there are significant costs to streaming our services and we hope you will support our streaming ministry with generous donations. We have no plans of offering less ministry or of being “closeted” about who we are or what we do.

Together, we’ll stay strong and stand for our right to exist, to love, and to worship as the people of God that we are.

There is not yet reason to give into fear, and one of the reasons we are not overly afraid is because we are being proactive to stay as safe as possible in uncertain times.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

December 19: Ibrahim Abdurrahman Farajajé (1952 – 2016) – was a Queer theologian, Bisexual, HIV/AIDS activist, interfaith scholar, artist, and spiritual leader. He died at age 63 in Oakland, California. Formerly known as Elias Farajajé-Jones, he one of the first Black male students at Vassar, where he received a degree in religion in 1972. He went on to earn a Masters of Divinity degree from St. Vladimir’s Eastern Orthodox Seminary in New York and a doctorate in theology from the University of Bern, Switzerland. Farajajé taught for 10 years at Howard University School of Divinity in DC. He was the first faculty advisor to Howard University’s LGBTQ group Oxala. In 1995 he joined the faculty at the Starr King School for the Ministry, a Unitarian Universalist/Multireligious graduate school in Berkeley, CA. He spent 21 years teaching at Starr King, where he was known with fond respect as “Ibrahim Baba.” His scholarly interests included intersectionality, performances of genders and sexualities, ritual, environmental politics, politics of identity, postcolonialism, Islam and Sufism, Jewish and Christian mysticism, Eastern Orthodoxy, global HIV, transphobia, heteronormativity, death penalty abolition, and more. He knew 16 languages. He considered himself to be a “scholartist” — scholar, artist, activist.

December 21: Apostle Thomas (d. 72) – there is a sayings gospel attributed to Thomas (Gospel of Thomas) which may be as old as the canonical Gospel of Mark (c. 70 CE). Thomas was the only apostle not in hiding after Jesus’ execution. When others claimed to have experienced a resurrected Jesus, Thomas doubted them and said he would have to experience it for himself. Thomas was also the only apostle who voiced support for Jesus’ journey to visit Lazarus when he was ill. The other apostles were afraid the trip was dangerous, and Thomas said that as his disciples they should share in the danger and go with him. Thomas shows us that honest doubt can be part of profound faith.

December 23: Warren Felt Evans (1817 – 1889) – attended Middlebury and Dartmouth colleges. He became a Methodist minister and then left Methodism to join the Swedenborgian church (Church of the New Jerusalem). After visiting Phineas P. Quimby (the “father” of New

Thought) for treatment for an ailment, Evans himself became a “mind cure” practitioner. He was the first to write about the healing methods used and taught by Phineas Quimby. WFE declared, “All outward power that we exercise over the things about us is but a shadow in comparison with the inward power that resides in imagination and will.”

Rabbi Abraham Heschel (1907-1972)—Teacher. A major force in Jewish spiritual renewal, Heschel came from a long line of Hasidic rabbis. After studying philosophy at Warsaw and Berlin he taught at several universities, eventually escaping to the United States from Nazi Germany. As a champion of interfaith dialogue, his writings exerted a tremendous influence on Christian thought. With a deep sense of prophetic justice, he sought to connect the mysticism of his Hasidic faith with the modern secular world.

Johnnie Coleman (1920 – 2014) – Johnnie Coleman experienced a dramatic healing when she discovered New Thought, but soon after encountered racism when she began studying for the ministry. Nevertheless, she completed her ministerial studies and was ordained. Later, she founded her own church (Christ Universal Temple), an association of churches and ministries (Universal Foundation for Better Living), and a ministry school. The theology of CUT & UFBL is “Fillmorean” (the philosophy of Charles and Myrtle Fillmore). Coleman taught the affirmation, “I am the thinker that thinks the thought that makes the thing.”

December 24: St. Eugenia of Alexandria (3rd century) – converted by and martyred with Protus and Hyacinth, her chamberlains (they were eunuchs). Eugenia was daughter of Philip, Duke of Alexandria/Governor of Egypt. She left her father’s house dressed as a man and was baptized by Bishop Helenus. She later became an abbot (dressing and living as a man). She converted her father to Christianity and he became a bishop (and martyr). She is said to have had a dream wherein Christ told her that she would die on Christmas Day. She was beheaded on December 25, 258.

Norman Vincent Peale (1898-1993) – Champion of positive thinking and author of *The Power of Positive Thinking* and founder of *Guideposts Magazine*. Peale was a Methodist minister who became Dutch Reformed so that he could pastor New York’s prestigious Marble Collegiate Church. Peale famously taught, “Change your thoughts and you change your world.” He also said, “If you paint in your mind a picture of bright and happy expectations, you put yourself into a condition conducive to your goal.” He praised enthusiasm: “There is real magic in enthusiasm. It spells the difference between mediocrity and accomplishment.” And he encouraged optimism: “Stand up to your obstacles and do something about them. You will find they haven’t half the strength you think they have.”
