The Purpose of the Annual Meeting

The annual meeting is a chance for us to receive a summary of the previous year's progress and/or challenges and a reminder of what the vision for the upcoming year entails. In years when there are matters to be voted on, a forum will be held before the day of the meeting so that people can ask questions and speak to issues. On the day of the vote, there is no further discussion. On years when there is no vote, the meeting is simply to share reports with those who are interested. A compilation of reports will always be available in print for those who want them who were unable to attend the meeting.

How is Information Available During the Year

- 1. All Cathedral board meetings are open and can be attended by every member. One must be on the agenda to speak, but the business that is handled by the board is open for everyone to witness. The board meets 10 times per year (second Tuesday of most months at 7 pm).
- 2. The Financial Health Team meets, as scheduled, At that meeting, the entire ministry plan is discussed line by line. All questions are welcome and are answered. The FHT is made up of staff and Cathedral Board, but any Cathedral member may attend the meeting and at that meeting may ask any question about church finances.
- 3. All staff members are available to the congregation by phone or email. You can always ask a question. If the person you ask isn't the best person to ask, she or he will refer you to the proper authority.
- 4. The *Sun Burst* is published weekly. That publication contains multiple pages of information every week throughout the year. Highlights from the *SunBurst* are also sent out most weeks by email. Archived copies of the *SunBurst* can be found on the church website.
- 5. Weekly and monthly financial reports are emailed by the Minister of Administration to the Cathedral Board and posted on the Cathedral's web site www.sunshinecathedral.org.
- 6. Announcements are made at the beginning of every worship service, and slides with information are rotated before each service.
- 7. Additional information can be found on our website and on the church's Facebook page.
- 8. In addition to these many ways of staying informed, there is an Annual Meeting every January where information is summarized and shared.

Conduct for Public Meetings

Our rules for discussion for all Sunshine Cathedral meetings, classes, and forums are based on the V.I.S.I.O.N.S. model. (V.I.S.I.O.N.S. is a multi-cultural, diversity training and consultation firm committed to anti-oppression work):

- 1. It's OK to disagree.
- 2. Do not blame, shame, or attack anyone
- 3. Practice both/and thinking (as valid as your opinion may be, it probably isn't the only valid opinion and there is probably more than one way to accomplish any worthy goal)
- 4. Be aware of intent and impact (our intentions are usually good, or at very least neutral, but our words and actions may impact others more negatively than we had intended)
- 5. "Try on" new ideas before dismissing them or reacting negatively to them
- 6. Practice self-focus (rather than belittling or insulting someone with a different view, we can simply own our own feelings by saying, "I feel" or "I think" or "I would prefer" rather than "you're wrong" or "what were you thinking?!" or "that's stupid." Also, we speak only for ourselves; we are never the spokespersons for unnamed, faceless "others" (the infamous "they" or "everybody" that are often invoked to persuade an ideological opponent)

By using these simple guidelines for discussion, there is no topic that we can't discuss and even when we disagree, we can do so in ways that are helpful, respectful, and that will build us up rather than tear us apart. By committing to respectful dialogue, even our disagreements can be part of a healthy process that will contribute to the vitality of our congregation.

Direct Dealing

We have a direct dealing policy at Sunshine Cathedral. Public meetings are not the place to initially air grievances. When we have conflict or a misunderstanding with someone in church leadership, the FIRST step is to speak with that person directly. If that proves to be unsatisfactory, then the SECOND step is to speak with that person and a mediator. If that doesn't work, then speaking to someone's supervisor might be in order.

It is always appropriate to ask questions before making accusations, and one should always deal directly with a person rather than resorting to triangulation tactics (going around a person or behind the person, trying to vilify the person to others or build a coalition against the person before a direct discussion with the person has even taken place). Triangulation is considered antagonistic behavior and is unworthy of any principled organization, and especially any organization founded on a commitment to spiritual growth and vitality.

If there are questions about fiduciary concerns, the FIRST step is to ask questions of the Administrative Staff . That should almost always settle the matter as a member of the Administrative Staff is the person with the most current and complete information about all financial matters. However, if you feel that the Administrative Staff has not responded to you sufficiently, you should attend a Financial Health Team meeting. At that meeting every line item is addressed and every question that is raised is answered. In the unlikely event that the first two steps didn't answer your questions satisfactorily, you can then ask to be added to the agenda for a Board of Director's meeting. Once on the agenda, you can make a statement to the board which will listen to you and will decide if further action is warranted.

Offering a safe and open community for people to worship, learn and grow in their faith is our deep desire. We are committed to equipping ourselves and each other to do the work that God has called us to do in the world.

Providing a message of liberation from the oppressive religious environment of our day or to those experiencing God for the first time is what guides our ministry. We believe that when people are invited to experience God through the life and ministry of Christ, lives will be transformed.

Social Action

Working to talk less and do more, we are committed to resisting the structures that oppress people and standing with to those who suffer under the weight of oppressive systems, being guided always by our commitment to Global Human Rights.

Sunshine Cathedral strongly promotes MCC founder Troy Perry's original Three-Pronged Gospel:

- ~ Christian Salvation (saved from hopelessness, degradation, & despair)
- ~ Christian Community (modeled after the healing love demonstrated by Jesus, inclusive of those who identify as Christian and those who don't)
- ~ Christian Social Action (justice work to build the kin-dom of God on earth)

And Sunshine Cathedral shares the values articulated in the Mission and Vision of the International Council of Community Churches:

Mission: "As people devoted to following Christ we are committed to community, to treasuring diversity, to living our faith in service and love."

Vision: "To affirm individual freedom of conscience, protect and promote congregational self-determination, proclaim that the love of God – which united – can overcome any division, be an integral partner in the worldwide ecumenical movement."

At the last annual meeting (Jan 2021) we thought 2022 would be a different year, with the pandemic waning. It did not work out that way.

Still, we had an incredible year with Identified Giving up \$55,000.00 than the Ministry Plan budgeted.

Fundraising was not a viable option.

Easter and Christmas were good with our congregation being faithful givers.

PPP loans for 2020 forgiven

We also receive grants from the community

In our type of "business" there are no guarantees with money. We may make a plan to fund different things for the upcoming year, but if there is no money they are not funded.

We start the year with a funding gap, and work all year and by Dec 31 the gap is zero.

January 15, 2023 Annual Meeting Senior Minister's Report

Dear friends and co-laborers,

Pandemic decimated churches all over the US and the world. Many churches did not survive, most went online for a while, and when it was time to return to in the room worship, some out of caution for their health, and others because they had embraced a new normal, many did not return (or they did so with less frequency that pre-pandemic).

Sunshine Cathedral was not spared these realities, but we did what we do no matter what we must face... we responded with faith and creativity to the realities at hand and figured out ways to reach people with a message that we believe is life-giving and life-enhancing.

While in the room attendance plummeted in 2020 (we didn't allow anyone in the room for a few months, and limited the number that could be in the room for many more months), our virtual attendance skyrocketed. In 2019, for example, we had 21,544 in the room worshipers and 1,066, 728 online worshipers. In 2020 (the year society largely shut down), our in the room attendance dramatically fell to 8,324 in the room worshipers, while our online worshipers more than quadrupled to 5,001,356. We grew by 4 million in pandemic even with the room being empty for a few months and limited to 25% capacity for many months thereafter.

In 2021, in the room attendance increased only slightly, but online growth continued with over a million more views, 6,112,599 total.

And in 2022, in the room attendance (finally, toward the very end of the year) started to climb again giving us 10,344 for the year but exponential online growth continued, giving us 8,107,417 views for 2022. However, those numbers are just from Facebook and YouTube. Remember, in 2022 we also increased our broadcasting venues to include Roku, Apple TV, Google TV, and Amazon Fire. We don't have all the data from those outlets, but we can safely assume that at least another half million people accessed us through those additional outlets.

It's a new day and a new world, and in this age of newness, we have managed to remain relevant, creative, and adaptive. We are reaching and engaging more people than at any time in our church's history.

Of course, the campus (Sunshine Cathedral Square) is back to serving thousands of people each week (Senior Center, chorus rehearsals, HOUT broadcasting, 12 step groups, etc.), our food sharing ministry set a new record by serving 31,392 in 2022, in 2022 we had more people giving online than ever before (the number of givers more than doubling over the last four years).

In 2022, the Sunshine Cathedral did a soft launch of a new capital campaign and that campaign is becoming more vocal and visible in 2023.

Throughout 2022 we continued to offer online Religious Education programs (including an online religious conference), and at the end of 2022 we started offering on-site studies again with a 4 week "Drag Bible Story Hour" at the end of the year. The Story Hour was a serious bible study but I led it in drag to make a statement in support of those being targeted and persecuted by religious groups and politicians for drag performance and/or for transgender identity.

The Performing Arts Series came back to life in 2022 with vibrant, if not always sold out, audiences. Our projections for 2023 suggest a more robust attendance for the shows.

After a few false starts and setbacks, the choir finally was able to return in 2022, and thanks to our staff musicians, we had beautiful music if a less populated choir loft throughout pandemic. We are happy that the choir is back.

Our virtual congregation in Second Life continues to meet, and we are once again offering worship services at local Assisted Living Facilities. We have also been able to share clergy with two nearby churches who have been experiencing pastoral transitions.

SAGE now has an office at Sunshine Cathedral Square. The SAGE program pairs volunteer companions with LGBT seniors.

Social Hall hospitality returned on Sundays in late 2022.

As your senior minister, I organized and spoke at the Lumination Conference here at Sunshine Cathedral, organized and spoke at the Divine Science Federation's Biennial Conference, continue to serve as the President of the Divine Science Federation, spoke at the annual International New Thought Alliance Conference, and had a chapter published in the Queer Bible Commentary, 2nd edition. Robert and I were also honored to be on the December cover of Outclique Magazine with a lovely article about us and Sunshine Cathedral in the issue.

That's a lot of good news and achievements, but I must also share some on-going challenges.

Payroll support from the government, grants from several organizations, a monthly allowance for one year from the Sunshine Cathedral Foundation, a line of credit with the Foundation, and people giving faithfully throughout pandemic made 2020 and 2021 blessed years for Sunshine Cathedral in an otherwise precarious period. We give thanks to and for those who helped us thrive during that uncertain time.

But the SCF can't give us an allowance every year, we must repay the line of credit, there will be no more government assistance with payroll, and grants differ in size and availability from year to year.

Because of our strong performing arts series that serves the community and supports the ministries of the church and employs Queers artists, we were confident of getting an Arts grant in 2022, but we were denied. Also, our endowment fund helps us by giving us quarterly payouts, but because of the stock market during pandemic and our own "floor" (below which we will not draw in order to preserve the endowment), we have missed THREE quarterly payouts. All of this while prices on many goods and services have increased.

So, while we usually end each year in the Black, we ended 2022 slightly in the Red. The good news is, most of that is what we owe "ourselves"...that is, payments for various services or credit to our partners... we will catch up with those but weren't able to do so by December 31.

Remember, we have no mortgage, we have a multi-million dollar property, and while it hasn't paid us dividends lately, we have a three quarter of a million dollar endowment, and we have a Foundation with separate accounts. We are in great shaped, we just have a few aged payables and we don't like having those when we close a year, but overall, we are doing fine.

We survived!

We've grown tremendously in many ways, becoming the very model of a healthy, successful, hybrid church of the 21st century.

And while the pandemic and the economy it impacted has left us not quite as comfortable as we like to be at year's end, we nevertheless are healthy and strong and we are excited for the opportunities that exist for us in 2023.

Your gifts of time, talent, treasure, and testimony have kept us vibrant in difficult days, and I know that our future is bright. Thanks for all you do. Your faithfulness will continue to make miracles happen in, through, and for Sunshine Cathedral.

"To support the mission and vision of the Sunshine Cathedral, and future capital building and property needs by maintaining an active Board of Governors and by organizing outreach and/or fund-raising efforts."

SUNSHINE CATHEDRAL FOUNDATION ANNUAL REPORT 2022

The accomplishments and challenges of this past year can be marked by one word: "Infrastructure." With many of the pandemic-related challenges behind us, the Sunshine Cathedral Foundation turned its attention from emergency support and assistance to the Cathedral to a focus on the future and enhancing and securing the Sunshine Cathedral physical and virtual spaces for many years to come for our local congregation and global fellowship, thereby embodying our motto — "Lighting the Way to a Brighter Tomorrow."

The Foundation Board of Governors has marked this year with several accomplishments and a continued commitment to future service and support. The soft launch of the "50th Anniversary Capital Make-Over Campaign" continued through the year with some major contributors and investments in our Sunshine Cathedral Square campus and virtual space. Of the \$330,000 three-year campaign goal, over \$105,000 has been expended to-date toward stated campaign goals, to include the renovation, tiling and re-painting of the Cathedral Square courtyard buildings; the completion and unveiling of a multi-building, multi-story mural by renowned local artist, Trey Opp (a/k/a "Topp Artist"); repair and re-striping of the parking lot; and investment in enhanced audio-visual capabilities to support virtual broadcasting to the Sunshine Cathedral Global Fellowship. Renewed focus on gaining additional financial support and commitments will continue in 2023 and beyond, with a joint endeavor between the Sunshine Cathedral and the Foundation. We are grateful to the Cathedral for the much-needed support and assistance.

In addition to major progress in the Capital "Make-Over" Campaign, the Sunshine Cathedral Foundation continued its commitment to on-going repairs and maintenance of Cathedral Square, in the amount of over \$30,000, of which more than \$16,000 was for repairs to the many aging air conditioning systems and units on the Square, thereby emphasizing the need for assessment and scheduled replacement of many, if not all, over the next few years. Also, like many of you, we saw a significant increase in the annual property insurance premium, though lower than for many

commercial properties. Our other coverages (flood, liability, etc.) remained relatively constant, yielding a total expenditure toward protection of over \$58,000. Finally, payment to Broward County for an annual storm water assessment and other recurring financial expenses capped out 2022 expenditures at roughly \$102,785 above and beyond those for the capital campaign.

The ability to meet these and future commitments and needs could not be possible without the financial support and generosity of our Ambassadors Club members —individuals pledging regular support above and beyond normal giving to the Cathedral operations and ministries or capital campaign; the generous legacy bequests of our Pillars Foundation donors; our Capital Campaign contributors; and the support — financial and otherwise — of each of you.

The Foundation continues its focus on ensuring the security and long-term perpetuity of the Sunshine Cathedral through smart financial management policies and decisions. In 2022, the Sunshine Cathedral Foundation completed the sale of the T-Mobile antenna steeple lease with the intention of earmarking dividends from the invested proceeds towards annual insurance premiums. The Foundation also proceeded in its commitment to set aside reserves (approximately \$20,000 annually) to be used for the projected roof replacement of each of the campus buildings when the time comes, as a result of the continued blessings of the Sunshine Cathedral Fund at Our Fund and the regular dividends apportioned between the Cathedral and the Foundation.

We continue to work from our strategic plan to further develop our Core Services and Key Objectives to continue to support the ministry and mission of the Cathedral for future years:

- Core Services
 - a. Secure and maintain church property and equipment
 - b. Stewardship for Pillars Society, legacy giving, endowments, and Ambassadors Club
 - c. Support capital and facility needs per church leadership and vision
 - d. Be advocates and ambassadors for the vision of the church
- Objectives and Priority Actions
 - Maintain a safe and attractive facility
 - o Recruit and maintain an active Board of Governors
 - Meet current and future capital needs
 - Be advocates and ambassadors for the vision of the church

In summary, the Board is committed to doing whatever it can to ensure our church community and campus continues serving the many people who come to our church and campus every week and who visit it virtually on-line through its broadcast ministry. We remain committed to being working partners with our ministers and church staff.

As Foundation Chair, I have continued to be blessed by the on-going support of our Board of Governors, including our Vice Chair, Keith Muller; Cory Hagopian, Treasurer; Santiago Madrinan, Secretary; Chuck Lane, Facilities Team, working in close coordination with Rev. Dr. Robert Griffin,

Executive Minister. Santiago stepped aside from his role at the end of 2022 and we are thankful for his service as well as continued commitment as a Foundation Board Governor.

The Foundation Board of Governors gained two new members in 2022 – Corinne Hogan and John Kent. At the conclusion of 2022, Kewan Smith, a long-serving Governor on the Foundation Board, will transfer to the Heritage Board. Attendance at meetings has been good, although we, like many others, continue to take advantage of the convenience of virtual Zoom meetings. (The critical behind-the-scenes work of the Board is dependent on the volunteer work and individual commitment of each of its member Governors. Anyone who is interested in serving on our Board is encouraged to make your interest known to myself, any Board Governor or minister.)

[Please note that no member of the Board of Governors is paid for the work they do on behalf of the Foundation. An outside accounting firm audits our books annually.]

2022 Sunshine Cathedral Foundation Overview

1. FACILITY MANAGEMENT

The Foundation continues to support projects proposed by our ministers as well as addressing imminent needs. Our Facilities team continues to review and update a programmed schedule of future needs, matching anticipated capital improvement needs with available or projected resource, including addressing ongoing needs of Cathedral Square and emergent repairs. As we look to the current year and beyond, we will focus further on campus beautification and upgrades and improvements, with emphasis on the projects identified in the Sunshine Cathedral 50th Anniversary Capital Make-over Campaign.

2. MEMORIAL CHAPEL & COLUMBARIUM

The Sunshine Cathedral Memorial Chapel and Columbarium provides a beautiful and meditative final resting place for many past Cathedral members, family and friends, as well as peace of mind for future planning for many current Cathedral members. In 2023 we will further consider the addition of new niches in anticipation of continuing demand.

3. AMBASSADORS CLUB

Becoming a Sunshine Cathedral Foundation Ambassador, indicates regular support of the Foundation with unrestricted gifts, above-and-beyond regular Cathedral giving, of at least \$500 per person (or \$1,000 per couple) each year. These gifts support the Foundation's routine and recurring expenses, administrative costs and outreach efforts.

4. PILLARS SOCIETY

The "Pillars Society" is the heart of our program to secure the Sunshine Cathedral's future. It is the major means through which the Foundation must establish long-term investments and an endowment fund to support the Foundation, our Cathedral, as well as SunServe. Upon request, Pillars Society funds are used to support various needs of the Sunshine Cathedral; some funds are restricted, and the donors' wishes regarding how to use those funds are honored. The Sunshine Cathedral Foundation and the Sunshine Cathedral have established a financial relationship with OUR FUND, a community endowment fund dedicated to supporting organizations and functions of the LGBTQ community.

5. ABOUT THE SUNSHINE CATHEDRAL FOUNDATION

The Sunshine Cathedral Foundation was established to secure a home for the Sunshine Cathedral.

MISSION: To support the mission and vision of the Sunshine Cathedral and future capital, building and property needs by maintaining an active Board of Governors and by organizing outreach and/or fund-raising efforts.
