QUEER WATER CARRIER LED DISCIPLES TO UPPER ROOM FOR LAST SUPPER - by Rev. Kittredge Cherry

A queer person led the disciples to the Upper Room for the Last Supper with Jesus, according to LGBTQ-affirming Bible interpretations.

The story of the water carrier will be read at many churches worldwide during Holy Week, but most overlook this gender-variant bit player who makes a brief but important appearance.

Some progressive Bible scholars embrace the water carrier as a transgender ancestor or "trans-cestor" because he was seen as a man doing women's work. His gender transgression was so obvious that he stood out in a crowd. Jesus says to follow "a man carrying a jar of water." The gospels of both Mark and Luke describe how the disciples asked Jesus where to prepare the Passover meal that would turn out to be his Last Supper. Jesus gave unusual instructions:

"Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him. Say to the owner of the house he enters, 'The Teacher asks: Where is my guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' He will show you a large room upstairs, furnished and ready. Make preparations for us there." (Mark 14:13-15; see also Luke 22:9-11)

Jerusalem was crowded for Passover, so how were the disciples supposed to pick out this particular water carrier? Even standard commentaries explain that he stood out because usually only women carried water pitchers. Jesus told his disciples to follow a gender nonconformist.

Christ trusted a queer man to lead them to the next stop on their spiritual journey, to the room where the disciples share his Last Supper and later received the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

April 2: St. Mary of Egypt (344 – 421) – according to legend Mary of Egypt was a sexually insatiable libertine who went on an "anti-pilgrimage" to Jerusalem for the sole purpose of having dalliances with pilgrims. She tried to enter a church and an invisible force wouldn't permit her to do so. She then noticed an icon of the Blessed Lady Mary (Mother of the Lord) and dedicated her life to God on the spot. She then was able to enter the church. A "voice" told her that if she were to cross the Jordan she would find rest. She went to a monastery on the bank of the Jordan, made confession and received Holy Communion, and then crossed the river to spend the rest of her days as a hermit. She died alone and wasn't found for a year. When her body was found, it had not begun the decomposition process. The person who found her buried her with the help of a passing lion!

April 4: Martin Luther King, Jr. (1929-1968)—Apostle of freedom and renewer of society. Martin earned first a Bachelor's degree from Morehouse College, then a seminary degree from Crozier Divinity School, and finally a Ph.D. in Theology from Boston University. Later he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964. He was the spiritual leader of the modern Civil Rights movement. Inspired by the example of Gandhi, he led a campaign of nonviolent resistance to racial segregation, racism and poverty. He is best remembered for his famous "I Have a Dream" speech given at the Lincoln Memorial in Washington. He was repeatedly jailed and in 1968 he was assassinated in Memphis, TN.

April 7: Ernest Holmes (1887-1960) – Founder of Religious Science. Holmes was an influential figure in the New Thought movement. After studying philosophy and world religions independently, working with his brother who was a Congregational minister, and becoming ordained in the Divine Science movement, Holmes wrote The Science of Mind (among several books) and started the Religious

Science Church. In his The Art of Life, Holmes instructed, "When you pray or affirm your good, close the door of your consciousness to everything which denies this good and state your needs, not as a supplication but as an affirmation of acceptance...We shall not gain happiness by continuing to repeat mental patterns of unhappiness... Can we, in the midst of negative conditions, accept a great good? If we can we shall be complying with the Law of Life. We shall be giving Life a chance to work for us."

Fenwicke Holmes (1883 - 1973) - earned a B.A. from Colby College and attended Hartford Seminary and was ordained a Congregationalist minister (and later, a Divine Science minister). In addition to assisting his brother (Ernest Holmes) in the Science of Mind movement, he also served as the pastor of a Divine Science church. He was helpful in spreading New Thought philosophy in Japan through his collaboration with Seicho-No-le's founder, Masaharu Taniguchi. Fenwicke's books include: Being & Becoming (1925), The Law of Mind in Action (1926), and The Truth About Matter (1944). He wrote a poem in the divine voice: "I am thy life within thee, I am thy health; I am thy choicest treasure, I am thy wealth. I am thy deepest wisdom, I am thy light; I am thy power within thee, I am thy might. I am thy warm emotion, I am thy truth; I am thy ageless heritage, I am thy youth. I am thy hope of heaven. I am the way: I am the light eternal. I am the day. I am thy will-to-conquer, I am thy sword; I am the peace thou cravest, I am thy word...I am the Inner Presence, Forever nigh – Whenever thou dost say, 'I am': I AM That I."

April 8: Sidhartha Gautama, the Buddha (circa 560 – 480 BCE) – Buddha means "Awakened." He was born in what is today Nepal and he died in India. The Buddha is said to have had a dramatic experience whereby he became "awake" (or enlightened), and then set about teaching others how they, too, could learn to live as fully awake beings. Many Buddhists speak of the "Buddha Nature" that is latent within all of us; as we achieve enlightenment (or awakening), we express that Buddha Nature. The Buddha is regarded as the model, or supreme Buddha, but others have been thought to achieve enlightenment. Compare this to the belief that some have that Jesus demonstrates the Christ Principle that is latent within all people.

The Buddha taught that suffering is caused by ignorance. Attachment and craving are symptoms of ignorance. By learning the Truth (and practicing what we learn), we can change our thoughts and attitudes, that is, we can control our cravings and thereby limit suffering. Buddha taught and practiced meditation and gave an 8-fold righteous path to follow, which included right understanding, right thinking, right speech, and right action.

THEOLOGY OF DRAG PERFORMANCE by Rev. Dr. Durrell Watkins

Sunshine Cathedral has multiple ecclesiastical affiliations, including an historical connection with Metropolitan Community Churches (aka MCC, a denomination founded by a Queer person with an affirming outreach to LGBTQ people).

In MCC history, many churches began in Gay bars (where drag performance was normative) and "drag shows" were often done to raise money for new MCC congregations. Drag is a foundational and formative part of our sacred history.

Metropolitan Community Churches began 9 months before the Stonewall Riots and were always part of the LGBTQ Liberation efforts. The spirit of Stonewall, where drag performers and transgender women protested for LGBTQ dignity and equality, was already moving in MCC as of October 6, 1968 (MCC's first worship service).

Trans & non-binary people and drag performers are the shamans and warriors of LGBTQ history. They are our saints, prophets, and heroes. At Sunshine Cathedral (#MyQueerChurch) we consider their witness and legacy to be holy.

World famous drag artist RuPaul says, "We're all born naked and the rest is drag." Costumed performance and gender bending performances aren't limited to so-called drag shows. For more than a century, from movies to television to plays to sketch comedy, we have seen performers who identify as one gender performing the role of a character of a different gender.

"Drag" at Sunshine Cathedral is used to described any costumed performance or presentation that is unlike one's daily routine. For example, we call our vestments "clergy drag." In fact, noting that men and women wear the same "clergy drag" (robes that flow like gowns) regardless of their gender identities, and that this is true of not only Sunshine Cathedral worship but of liturgical churches everywhere, we say both humorously and sincerely, that the Christian liturgy is the longest running drag show in history.

In Ezekiel 1.28 the prophet envisions the divine to be like a Rainbow. The Rainbow, then, can be considered God's drag. At Jesus' baptism, God shows up in Dove drag. Some have even said that angels are God in drag.

At Sunshine Cathedral, Drag performance is not only embraced, it is celebrated for its contributions to our sacred history and it is included in our theology and worship. In fact, whenever we gather (whether for a cabaret, a concert, a comedic performance, a "drag show", a film showing, or a liturgy), we are gathering in the spirit of love and are opening ourselves to the transformative power of art and community. So, a drag performance at our church is a sacred gathering, a form of worship, as are all gatherings where human potential is affirmed and human dignity is recognized and community is lovingly formed and shared.
