Acts of the Apostles

(10.1-17, New Catholic Bible) - Rev Dr Anne Atwell

In Caesarea, there was a man named Cornelius who was a Roman centurion. He was a devout [believer in the Hebrew God], as were all the members of his household. He gave alms generously to the people and prayed constantly...

One afternoon about three o'clock, he had a vision in which he clearly saw an angel of God approaching him and calling to him, "Cornelius!" He stared at him in terror and asked, "What is it, Lord?"

The angel said, "Your prayers and acts of charity have ascended as a memorial offering before God. Now send someone to Joppa and summon a man named Simon, who is also called Peter... When the angel who spoke to him had departed, he summoned two of his servants and a devout soldier on his staff. He told them all that had happened and sent them to Joppa.

About noon the next day, as they were on their way and approaching the city, Peter went up on the roof to pray. He became hungry and wanted something to eat, but while it was being prepared, he fell into a trance. He then saw heaven opened and something that looked like a large sheet descending, being lowered to the ground by its four corners. In it were all kinds of four-footed animals as well as reptiles and birds of the air.

A voice then said to him, "Get up, Peter! Kill and eat!" But Peter said, "Certainly not, Lord. For I have never eaten anything profane or unclean." The voice spoke again to him, for a second time, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." This happened three times, and then immediately the object was taken up into heaven again.

While Peter was wondering about the meaning of the vision he had seen, suddenly the men who were sent by Cornelius appeared. They had asked for directions to Simon's house, and now they were standing at the entrance.

Acts of the Apostles

(10.34-48, New Catholic Bible) - Rev Dr Anne Atwell

Then Peter addressed them: "I now understand how true it is that God has no favorites, but that in every nation all those who [revere] God and do what is right are acceptable...

[God] sent [God's own] word to the children of Israel and proclaimed the good news of peace through Jesus Christ, who is the Lord of all.

"You are well aware of what was proclaimed all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism of John, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the holy Spirit and with power. He went around doing good and healing all those who were oppressed by [evil], for God was with him.

"We are witnesses to everything he did in the countryside and in Jerusalem. He was put to death...but God raised him to life...He commanded us to preach to the people and to bear witness that he is the one

designated by God as Judge of the living and the dead... While Peter was still speaking, the holy Spirit

descended upon all who were listening to his message. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astonished that the gift of the holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also. For they heard them speaking in tongues and proclaiming the greatness of God.

Peter said further, "Can anyone withhold the water of baptism from these people who have received the holy Spirit just as we have?" Then he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

"Sunshine Cathedral is a different kind of church where: *Our God is love. *Kindness is our worship. *Compassion is our prayer. *The sacred value of all people is our creed; and *Healing the hurts caused by hatred is our mission.

SOCIAL HALL HOSPITALITY – Coffee and treats between 10 am and 10:30 am. This gives people leaving the first service and those coming to second service both a chance to have a little pick me up and also meet one another.

PRAYING FOR LOVED ONES (by Rev. Dr. Durrell Watkins) Realizing that "God shows no partiality" and that divine love excludes no one, and that not every prayer leads to desired results, and that it can even be insensitive to categorize our good fortune as "blessings" or "miracles" when others did not experience the same "lucky" breaks, someone recently asked me if I think it is wrong to ask God to help our loved ones. The short answer is, "of course not." If the prayer gives us comfort or hope, then who could quibble with that? And anyway, such prayers are really expressions of love and good wishes, and for all I know, love and good wishes have almost magical properties that can influence outcomes in life.

If we think of prayer as energy and our minds as conduits through which that energy can flow and reach those for whom we pray, then that may prove to tip the scales as well, at least on occasion.

And if consciousness is non-local, and I'm pretty sure that it is, then we are all connected and our prayers for one another are like an energy hug, and hugs in any form can have a healing, comforting effect. Oh, I believe in prayer and have benefited from it my whole life.

What I don't want us to do is to confuse the cries of our

hearts for theology, that is, if I ask God to intervene (as one might even if one doesn't normally think of God as likely to intervene), that is about my longing and not about how God operates in our world.

Rather than asking God to intervene, celebrating then when things go our way and doing mental gymnastics to keep our faith when they don't (or, perhaps more painfully, losing our faith entirely), I would rather think of prayer as a way that we express love.

Yes, love can work miracles; I would argue that love itself is a miracle. But our prayers, our spiritual hugs, need not be about a God who says yes sometimes and no at other times.

God, in my current understanding and experience, is ultimate reality, the ground of being, all that is, the whole that is greater than the sum of its parts (we are among the parts), the eternal and omnipresent power of love - which is the power to care, to embrace, to bear witness, to include, perhaps even to influence, but that never excludes anyone, never forces anything, and never plays favorites among us. Optimism can make a difference, but expecting a deity beyond us to help some of us sometimes tends to infantilize us, lead us to blaming the victim when people of faith suffer, and can even bring us great grief when the mighty Olympians seem to ignore or abandon us.

I believe in prayer. I appreciate prayer. And, one of the healing benefits of the prayer journey is learning to pray in ways that don't reinforce victimhood, that don't necessitate defending God when the magic doesn't work, and that leaves us somehow empowered and comforted no matter how things turn out.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

April 23: Cesar Chavez (1927-1993)—Farmworker. Raised in a family of Mexican-American migrant workers, Chavez transformed a local labor struggle into a moral cause that challenged the conscience of the nation. He was committed to absolute nonviolence, and was supported by many religious leaders. Inspired by a priest who gave him a passion for justice, and a community activist who taught him how to organize, he became the driving force in founding the United Farmworkers Union.

April 25: St. Mark the Evangelist—Evangelist. The writer of the oldest gospel in our canon. Mark's gospel was written around 70 CE.

April 27: Ralph Waldo Emerson (1803 – 1882) -American essayist, philosopher, poet, and leader of the Transcendentalist movement in the early 19th century. His teachings directly influenced the growing New Thought movement of the mid-1800s. Emerson wisely noted, "A person will worship something, have no doubt about that. We may think our tribute is paid in secret in the dark recesses of our hearts, but it will come out. That which dominates our imaginations and our thoughts will determine our lives, and our character. Therefore, it behooves us to be careful what we worship, for what we are worshipping, we are becoming." Referring to divine unity and omnipresence, Emerson wrote, "the currents of the Universal Being circulate through me; I am part and parcel of God."

April 28: Oskar Schindler (1908-1974) — "Righteous Gentile." Schindler was a German industrialist who made a fortune on the labor of Jews in his factory. Although raised as a Catholic, he was not religious. For reasons which have never been clear, and at great personal risk, he used his power and influence to save the lives of 1,100 men, women, and children during WW2. At the end of the war he was impoverished. Today he is buried in Jerusalem at Yad Vashem (Holocaust Memorial) among the "Righteous Gentiles."

April 29: St. Catherine of Siena (1347-1380)—Doctor of the Church. An Italian mystic, teacher, and nun, Catherine devoted herself to serving the poor and sick around her. She experienced ecstatic visions and was believed to have received the sign of the stigmata.
