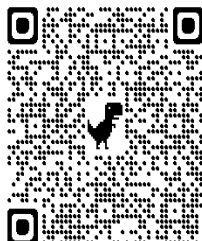

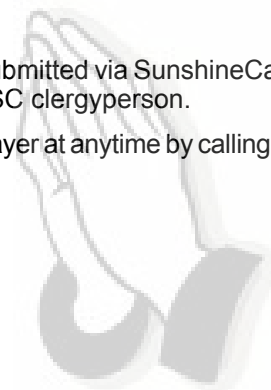

MOVIE NIGHT – Join Pastor Robert for a Movie Night at the Gateway Theater ... for whatever is playing on 31 May at the 7PM hour.

SUMMER CLUB – every year we designate a few weeks as our Summer Club collection time. The Summer Club is simply anyone and everyone who gives a bit extra in May and June to help us face the shortfalls that summers traditionally have brought. If those who travel will remember to donate even while they are away, and those in our Global/Virtual congregation continue to donate, and everyone who can gives a bit extra (that could be \$5 or \$10 more each week, or a one-time extra gift of any size), we'll get through summer with relative ease and never miss a beat in providing ministry to our local and global communities.

PENTECOST SUNDAY - Today is Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost was a Jewish Harvest festival and it was on the day of Pentecost, Luke tells us in the Book of Acts, that the Jesus movement was invigorated by a movement of the holy Spirit. From Advent through Eastertide we focus on Jesus, his teachings, his life, and how people experienced him or his memory; from Pentecost until Advent, we focus on the Church as being Christ in the world, continuing the work of building a just and loving and inclusive "kin-dom" on earth, as Jesus believed was possible.

FALL CRUISE – Cruise With Sunshine and Your Friends In Our Greece Fundraiser Cruise Tour! And, we have a contest where you have a chance to travel for free.

RAFFLE: Every friend that travels with you enters you in the raffle to cruise for free. Meaning 4 friends traveling with you means 4 chances for you to cruise for free.

BONUS: In addition to raffle entry, for every friend that travels with you, you get \$100 on the ship. Meaning if 4 friends travel with you, you get \$400 to spend on board your cruise.

SOCIAL HALL HOSPITALITY – Coffee and treats between 10 am and 10:30 am. This gives people leaving the first service and those coming to second service both a chance to have a little pick me up and also meet one another.

AREAS OF SERVICE – Would you like to join the choir (they rehearse weekly and sing at both Sunday morning services)? Could you help us as an usher? Do you like to clean? Would you like to bake desserts or make dips or finger sandwiches for Social Hall Hospitality? There are several areas where you can get more involved. Everyone needs to meet people and have something to do, and giving service to an area of ministry at Sunshine Cathedral is a great way to achieve both goals.

LOAVES & FISHES SUNDAY – First Sunday of every month (next Sunday) you are invited to bring non-perishable food items to help stock our food sharing pantry. This is one of the ways we combat food insecurity.

WE NEED SUNSHINE CATHEDRAL TO REPRESENT DURING PRIDE – the first Pride Parade was a memorial celebration of the Stonewall Uprising. As we all proudly remember, the Stonewall Uprising was when a gay bar in NYC was raided by the police but this time, people resisted. They marched in the streets, they chanted, they confronted the police, they surrounded the police, some threw objects. Many of those resisters were people of color, drag performers, and transgender people. So, one cannot honorably celebrate "Pride" without the inclusion of the drag and trans communities.

Sunshine Cathedral wants to march strong in this year's Pride Parade in memory and honor of those who are being unfairly excluded. Drag artists and transgender people are under attack these days, having their existence and their livelihoods criminalized state by state. This is a violation of free speech/expression, and for those of us who count such trans and drag figures among our saints and spiritual heroes, it's an infringement of religious freedom. In solidarity with the drag and trans members of our community, and in blessed memory of the righteous warriors of Stonewall whose actions inspired the first Pride Parades, Sunshine Cathedral wants to march in force this year. **We want 60 marchers or more!**

Let's march! Join us on Saturday, June 17th the parade begins at 7PM.

We need you. You can invite friends to join you. Let's show the world that the LGBTQ+ community is proud to be the people we are divinely designed to be, and we will not be silent when any segment of our community is being unfairly targeted. SAINTS OF THE WEEK

May 28: John Macquarrie (1919 – 2007) – a former Presbyterian turned Anglican priest and theologian. He has been described as the most distinguished Anglican theologian of the second half of the 20th century. He taught at the University of Glasgow (where he earned his PhD), Union Theological Seminary in NYC, and the Graduate Theological Foundation. He loved and was fully committed to the Christian tradition while also affirming the legitimacy of other traditions and the need to learn from them (though he did not favor syncretism). About non-Christian religions he said, "I do not deny for a moment that the truth of God has reached others through other channels..."

Charles Ludlam (1943 – 1987) – Off-Broadway director, playwright, and actor who founded the Ridiculous Theatre Company in New York City in 1967. Ludlam's plays featured absurdist elements, social critique, outrageous humor, and drag. Not really religious, Ludlam all the same had

a religious like devotion to his art and found spiritual strength, honesty, and empowerment from sharing his art. He was an openly gay man and in 1987 he died from AIDS related complications.

May 29: Baha'u'llah (1817-1892) – founder of the Baha'i Faith which focuses on the unity of God, religion, and humankind. Baha'is affirm the dignity of all people and the validity of most religions. They place a high value on peace and justice and oppose racism and nationalism. Baha'u'llah believed God became especially present in various ages in the lives of select prophets, including Buddha, Jesus, and Mohammad. Baha'u'llah believed himself to be a prophet (and the one specifically foretold by the Bab), which would make him, also, a divine manifestation. He and his followers were persecuted for their beliefs and Baha'u'llah died in prison.

May 30: St. Joan of Arc (1412?-1431)—Maid of Orleans and martyr. A young peasant girl, Joan believed she was being led by angelic voices to restore the French throne. Dressed as a soldier, she led the French army in several victories, until finally being captured by the English. In a church trial she was accused of heresy and witchcraft, and burned at the stake at the age of 19.

May 31: Visitation of Mary, the Blessed Lady—This day celebrates the visit of Mary with her cousin, Elizabeth, who was pregnant with John the Baptizer (Luke 1:39-56).

June 1: Lao Tzu (circa 600 BCE, China) - believed simplicity to be the path to freedom and happiness. He taught people to learn from the laws of nature, to develop intuition, to be loving, and to avoid using force. The teachings attributed to Lao Tzu (an honorary title, meaning something like "Wise Old Teacher") are found in the Tao te Ching.

St. Justin of Rome (c. 167)—Philosopher and Martyr. Justin came from a gentile family in Samaria. He studied all the major religious and philosophical movements of his day, eventually deciding to become a Christian. He saw Christian faith as the fulfillment of Greek philosophy. He later settled in Rome and, upon refusing to sacrifice to the gods, was scourged and beheaded.

June 2: Phebe Ann Coffin Hanaford, (May 6, 1829 – June 2, 1921) - Universalist minister who left her fundamentalist Baptist husband and lived for 30 years with Ellen Miles. She championed universal suffrage and was the first woman chaplain to the Connecticut legislature.

June 3: St. John XXIII (1881-1963)—Modernizer of the Church. When John was elected Pope he was expected to be no more than a transitional figure. In a brief pontificate of less than five years, John was able to bring about sweeping changes by opening the church up to positive dialogue with the modern world. John convened Vatican II (only the second council since the 16th century) as a pastoral council to address Christian unity, world peace, and the needs of the poor.
