FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Waiting on Jesus by Rev. Dr. Durrell Watkins (Senior Minister, Sunshine Cathedral)

Advent suggests something is coming, and until it arrives, we wait. I believe, however, that waiting need not be as passive as we tend to make it.

For what, exactly, are we waiting? Are we waiting for Christmas, a time to recall the birth of Jesus? Well, that's happened, and we make a much bigger deal of it than Jesus ever did. Jesus' birth is only mentioned twice in the bible and Jesus never mentions it as a big deal. The only thing St. Paul ever said about Jesus' birth is that he was "born of a woman." We might have figured that out!

So, if we are just waiting for the party to celebrate a birth that happened in Palestine some 2,027 years ago, then we are waiting for the past. There's never much power in worshiping the past or longing for its return.

Some will say that the wait isn't for Jesus' birth (or the commemoration of his birth), but for his return. Well, that wait is already a couple of millennia in process. Maybe that just isn't going to happen the way our ancestors imagined. The writer of Mark's gospel thought it would happen in his lifetime, and so did St. Paul. They, apparently, were mistaken.

Waiting for some future event to make everything alright mostly keeps us from doing what we can now to make things better. While we are waiting for a superhero to appear in the skies to save the day, we ought to be addressing climate change, poverty, racism, homophobia and transphobia, war, and women's right to bodily autonomy right here and right now. The mythic return hasn't happened and may not, so we better get to work.

But wait! (I couldn't help myself). The past and the future won't fix our messes, but we can make things better in the present, in the now. And maybe that's what we are waiting for...the realization that we have the power to make a difference, today.

Some believe (I am among them) that the Pentecost narrative in Acts 2 is a story about Christ's return. Jesus ascends into the unknown and the spirit that motivated his work descends upon the church days later, raising them up to be the body of Christ on earth, the Christ presence meant to continue doing what Jesus did: heal, empower, encourage, bring together, and cast a vision of what is possible for people who live in the in the power of love.

We are the return of Christ! We don't need to wait for the return, we need to wake up to the fact that we are it, and then get to work being Christ in the world.

And that brings me back to the word "wait." Waiting doesn't just mean sitting around until something turns up.

When we wait "on" someone, we are serving them. A waiter brings coffee or food or drinks, someone "waiting hand and foot" on a sick loved one is actively caring for them. To wait on Jesus could mean to serve Jesus' mission and we do that with our worship and also with our acts of kindness, generosity, compassion, and justice.

Something is coming and we are waiting for it. Maybe what is coming is a better world, and it will happen as we get busy waiting on the wounded, disenfranchised, lonely, degraded, forgotten, and oppressed of the world. Rather than waiting FOR Jesus, let's try to be like Jesus and wait ON those who are hurting, and that is what can transform the world. And for that, we are all still waiting,

ADVENT – Advent, observed in most Christian denominations, is the first Season of the Christian Year and begins 4 Sundays before Christmas. Advent is the season of waiting for the coming of Jesus Christ. For many, the wait is simply a time of preparation for the joyous celebrations of Christmas. For others, it is a time of waiting to see a return of Christ.

At Sunshine Cathedral we don't necessarily expect a literal return of Christ but rather find the Parousia (Greek word for "coming") to be symbolic of followers of Jesus learning to allow the light that was in Jesus to also shine here and now in our lives. Indeed, we often say that WE are the return of Christ, the Body of Christ continuing the work of Justice-Love in the world.

Advent is sometimes called "Little Lent" because it is a time of preparation and waiting. During the 4 weeks of Advent, we are asked to worship weekly, pray daily, and engage in acts of generosity. During Advent, we focus on the themes of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.

Advent begins the Christian year and is followed by Christmastide, Epiphany, Ordinary Time, Lent, Eastertide, Pentecost, and Ordinary Time. The liturgical cycles help us live our sacred stories and apply their lessons in our daily lives.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

December 3: Mary Baker Eddy (1821 – 1910): Author of Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures and Founder of the First Church of Christ, Scientist in Boston. Also the leading figure in the Christian Science movement. Mrs. Eddy said, "To those leaning on the sustaining infinite, today is big with blessings."

Freda Smith (1935 – 2019) – first woman to be licensed and ordained as clergy in Metropolitan Community Churches, first woman to serve on the Council of Elders in MCC, and the person who led the effort to make denominational bylaws gender inclusive. Her most famous sermon was "Purple Grass" about a lamb that was shunned for preferring purple grass to the more common green grass, but the Shepherd affirmed the lamb and assured it that it was loved just as it was. She was also known for a provocative performance piece, "Dear Dora/ Derek, Dangerous Diesel Dyke."

December 4: St. Barbara (d. 306) – Barbara, a pagan, embraced the Christian faith and dedicated herself to serving the Lord as a consecrated virgin. Her father tried to arrange marriages for her but she always refused. Her father had a bathhouse built for her. It became a place of healing. St. Simeon Metaphrastes compared it to the stream of Jordan.

In time, Barbara ran away from her father but he found her (with the help of a shepherd who, as a result of his helping to capture Barbara, found his flocks, according to legend, turned to locusts) and locked her away. Still she would not marry nor renounce her newfound faith. Prayer gave her the strength to endure her trials.

Finally, Barbara was condemned to death by beheading by her father. Her martyrdom took place on December 4th. Soon after, her father was struck by lightning.

December 5: John A.T. Robinson (1919 – 1983) was a bible scholar, Church of England bishop, and the Dean of Trinity College, Cambridge. He was a leader in liberal Christian theology and helped give shape to the field of secular theology. He believed in "universal salvation." His most popular book was "Honest to God" and he was a major influence on Bishop John S. Spong.

December 6: St. Nicholas (270-343) – known for compassion, courage, and generosity. He is the patron of sailors, pawnbrokers, and children. When his parents died, he gave most of his inheritance to the poor. Because of various miracles attributed to his intercession, he is sometimes called Nicholas the Wonderworker. He was a bishop in Asia Minor during the time of the Roman Empire. His great deeds as told in legend include resurrecting three children who had been killed by a nefarious butcher who killed them and intended to cure them as ham, offering himself in exchange for the release of captives, and attending the first Council of Nicea (his name is included in some records but not in others).

December 8: Bodhi Day - commemorates the day that the historical Buddha, Siddhartha Gautama (Shakyamuni), achieved awakening or enlightenment (bodhi in Sanskrit). Siddhartha had recently forsaken extreme ascetic practices and decided to sit under a tree and meditate until he found the root of suffering, and how to liberate oneself from it.

Pavel Florensky (1882-1937) - Russian Orthodox priest who wrote a theology of same-sex love in the early 20th century. He was executed as part of a Soviet anti-religious campaign.

December 9: Blessed Juan Diego (16th century)— Witness to Our Lady of Guadalupe. Mary appeared, it is said, to Juan Diego with dark skin and Indian features, surrounded by symbols of Indian religion and culture. She spoke to him in his native Nahuatl, not Spanish. The message to the church was clear: it must not serve as the agent of colonial oppression, but be rooted in the experience of the people.

Funds raised will go directly toward expanding food storage capacity for our Food Sharing Ministry and in return allow two significant opportunities:

- 1. Assist more individuals that experience Food Insecurities.
- 2. Allow our Food Sharing Ministry an opportunity to purchase food items in bulk at a lower fee.

Our Food Sharing Ministry, in its 7th year, includes three areas:

Loaves and Fishes: is the Sunday morning food collection of non-perishable food items used to replenish our Food Pantries. Loaves and Fishes food collection is held on the first Sunday of every month and special food collections also occur during Lent and Advent.

Brown Bag: provides small bags of food to various locations and organizations around Broward County. The Brown Bag is either a lunch bag or snack bag depending on the needs of the recipient. Approximately 450 – 550 Brown Bags are assembled every Wednesday.

Food Pantry: provides a grocery bag of pantry staples, bread, pastries, fresh produce, meat, milk, and other food (and non-food) items to those living with food insecurity in our local community. The Food Pantry is open every Wednesday from 10:45am until approximately 12:30pm and assists over 300 individuals each week. No documentation is required in order to receive food.
