From the Pastor's Desk



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Queer Evolution

(Senior Minister, Sunshine Cathedral)

I was a sissy. Then I was a boy trying to change or at least hide my sissiness. Then I was gay (I didn't "become" gay, I simply realized that what I was could be called "gay").

I didn't mind being "male" but I resisted "manhood." I didn't feel or act like most men. For a while, I decided that "boy" (even as I aged) was good enough...clearly male, but not quite a man. Much later I would discover the fluidity of non-binarism and that would seem to apply to my experience.

I joyfully landed on "Queer" as my identity... challenging gender norms and sexual binaries, bringing my experiences and feelings and perspectives into the study and practice of religion, and for that matter, of life. "Queer" was an umbrella term that included gays, lesbians, bisexuals, transgender, questioning, asexuals, straight allies, pansexuals, intersex, nonbinary, and almost anyone else who didn't fit into the sexual or gender status quo. It was inclusive and it represented some of the most creative people on earth. It was a big enough word to represent the sissy, the boy, the gay, the non-binary, the evolving person that I was...it included my past and left room for numerous possibilities for the future. And it took a word weaponized by bullies and reclaimed and redefined it to be a word of defiance and pride. And the word has been used in these liberating ways in activism and in the academy for six decades so far.

Another reason that I like the word "Queer" is because for me it is synonymous with the word "holy." Holy shares a root with "wholeness." To be holy is to be perfect, whole, very good. I found my wholeness and discovered my goodness in the work of Queer liberation and Queer theology. Queer means holy to me because it is how I most fully encountered and embraced holiness. Also, holy is thought to be "special", unlike what is usual, or "the norm"...holy is different, queer. When I consider the God that is both and neither female and male, that is beyond physicality but yet is embodied as the universe, that is Love free to love without limits or restrictions, and I reflect on how Queer such a God by definition is, then of course I am left understanding queer as holy (and holy as queer).

My doctoral thesis was titled "Popular Entertainment as Queer Canon" and I have a chapter in the Queer Bible Commentary, 2nd edition. All of Sunshine Cathedral's clergy are educated in Queer theological perspectives and Queer theology and Queer hermeneutics underpin

all the work of the Sunshine Cathedral, and has done so for many years.

Of course, not everyone loves the Q word and no one has to personally embrace it for themselves, but we do need to realize that for many it is a word of empowerment that has facilitated healing and just as some of us won't use it, neither should we discourage those who do use it from doing so. It's inclusive, it's an act of defiance and of reclamation, for some it's even holy.

I know women who prefer "gay" to lesbian, and others who prefer "lesbian" to queer and still others who prefer the term "queer women." Some in the African American community prefer the term "same-gender loving" to other designations. And what we use as much or more than anything else at Sunshine Cathedral is "LGBTQ+". Ours is a diverse community, and such diversity is itself pretty queer.

"Queer" not only separates us from race or class or gender privilege we might otherwise be able to claim, it also puts us in solidarity with those who were denied such privilege from the start. It fuels our work to share the healing power justice-love with all. Charity tries to soften the blow of injustice, but justice work tries to eliminate the injustice. Queer is a tool for justice, for dismantling systems of oppression, for disrupting the status quo. And to me, that sounds like the work of Jesus.

This Pride month I want us to not only feel "okay" about being gay or lesbian or bi or pan or ase or a straight ally or trans or non-binary...I want us to feel special, holy, and proud to be part of this Rainbow community with this world changing mission. Let's let our beautiful Rainbow Light shine brighter than ever this June. And let's keep evolving.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

June 2: Phebe Ann Coffin Hanaford, (May 6, 1829 – June 2, 1921) - Universalist minister who left her fundamentalist Baptist husband and lived for 30 years with Ellen Miles. She championed universal suffrage and was the first woman chaplain to the Connecticut legislature.

June 3: St. John XXIII (1881-1963) — Modernizer of the Church. When John was elected Pope he was expected to be no more than a transitional figure. In a brief pontificate of less than five years, John was able to bring about sweeping changes by opening the church up to positive dialogue with the modern world. John convened Vatican II (only the second council since the 16th century) as a pastoral council to address Christian unity, world peace, and the needs of the poor.

June 4: W. Frederic Keeler (1874 - 1943) - Noted healer and metaphysician (Divine Science minister). Most of his work was published posthumously. Of the power of prayer, Keeler said, "We drop our worldly worries in prayer. They do not exist in prayer...To face the facts of one's life without worry while being in the consciousness of God is to solve every problem, and to heal."

June 6: St. Philip the Deacon – one of the first 7 deacons of the Jesus Movement. May have been the one to baptize the Ethiopian eunuch in Acts 8.

Jeremy Bentham (1748 – 1832) – British philosopher who pioneered Biblical arguments for LGBTQ rights. Bentham presented Biblical evidence for Jesus' homosexuality as part of his theological defense for same-sex love in "Not Paul, but Jesus Vol. III." It was published for the first time in 2013 and is freely available to download or view online.

June 7: Chief Seattle (1786?-1866)—Chief of the Suquamish. As a child growing up on Puget Sound, Seattle witnessed the arrival of the first white settlers. When he became chief he tried to use peaceful dialogue, rather than violence, to coexist with the increasing demands of the new settlers. He and his people converted to Christianity, but he came to see that there were fundamental spiritual differences between his people and the settlers, especially in our relationship with the earth. He understood that "to harm the earth is to heap contempt on its Creator."

Alan Turing (1912 – 1954) – according to Kittridge Cherry, Turing “is a gay icon, pioneering computer scientist and British codebreaker. He is sometimes called a gay saint because his wartime codebreaking saved millions of lives, and a gay martyr because his conviction for homosexuality drove him to suicide.”
